

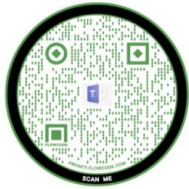

- Advise patients that obesity is a chronic medical disease and how a personalized approach to obesity treatment improves associated medical conditions.
- Discuss latest anti-obesity medications and novel therapies (i.e. endoscopic bariatric procedures, genetic testing) that target obesity and related cardiometabolic diseases.
- Outline personalized lifestyle strategies to sustainably improve metabolic health.
